Pinot Grigio, <i>Canaletto</i> , Italy, NV, 12% An elegant dry wine with floral notes and fresh flavours which provide a refreshing crisp finish.	£4.40	£6.20	£18
Marsanne Viognier, <i>Les Pierres Bordes</i> , France, 2022, 12.5% This fresh full-flavoured dry white wine has flavours of peach and apricot. A firm family favourite.	£5.00	£7.00	£20
Sauvignon Blanc, <i>Wolf Point</i> , Chile, 2022, 12.5% This bright sauvignon is bursting with crisp lemony and lightly tropical fruit.	£5.20	£7.20	£21
Chardonnay, <i>Domaine de Pennautier</i> , France, 2022, 13.5% A lovely, fruity chardonnay from outside Carcassonne in the Languedoc, where the slightly cooler climate allows the grapes to flourish and retain freshness.	£5.40	£7.60	£22
Vouvray, <i>Pierre Brévin</i> , France, 2021, 11.5% Pale yellow colour this off-dry wine an expressive bouquet with notes of flowers, ripe fruit (citrus, quince) and honey. Round and full with a great balance between sugar and acidity.	£5.40	£7.60	£22
Picpoul de Pinet, <i>Carte Noire</i> , France, NV, 12% Made exclusively from Piquepoul Blanc grown within the unique appellation of Picpoul de Pinet a few miles inland from the Mediterranean sea, this dry white wine is fresh and fruity with an elegant finish.			£21
Gavi, <i>La Luciana</i> , Italy, NV, 12.5% The Cortese grape is traditionally grown in the area around the town of Gavi, where it gives dry, lemony white wines. Fermented in stainless steel for a clean and elegant flavour.			£22
Chenin Blanc, Bellingham's <i>The Bernard Series</i> , South Africa, 2021, 13.5% This old-vine Chenin Blanc from coastal South Africa would make a great alternative to Chardonnay. A year's ageing in French oak results in a rich, full-bodied wine, with ripe tropical fruit flavours.			£24
Chablis, <i>UVC</i> , France, 2021, 12% This Chablis is made by a co-operative of smaller producers who have banded together to share the costs of bottling, marketing and transporting their wines. Rich minerality, orchard and citrus fruits.			£31
Albariño, <i>Paco &amp; Lola</i> , Spain, 2021, 12.5% Albariño has become extremely fashionable over the last few years and with this as an example you'll understand why. Excellent acidity with citrus notes, white flowers and aroma of lychees.			£34
Sancerre, <i>Moulin les Lys</i> , France, 2021, 13% The Reverdy-Ducroux has been producing wine on the Sancerre hillside for 14 generations; they've got quite good at it. A pale expressive wine with classic flavours: green apple, citrus and stone fruits.			£38
Savennières, <i>Clos du Petit Beaupreau</i> , France, 2019, 14% Savennieres is a little village, with only a handful of vineyards, famous for high quality chenin wines in a classic Old World style. Perfectly dry, with crisp freshness and full flavours and hint of honeysuckle			£37
Chablis Premier Cru, <i>Les Joyaux</i> , France, 2020, 12.5% This exceptional wine is suitable for a special occasion, or for making any occasion special. Partially oaked, this wine is intense and complex with apple and citrus fruits and the classic mineral flavours.			£42

Malbec, <i>Los Picos</i> , Argentina, 2020, 13.5%	£5.00	£7.00	£20
Made with handpicked grapes from the foothills of the Andes, this elegant Malbec is complex with blackberry and blueberry flavours with hints of peppery spice and distinct cocoa notes.			
Côtes du Rhône, <i>Cellier D'Or</i> , France, 2021, 13.5%	£5.00	£7.00	£20
If you prefer something a little lighter, this is a medium-bodied dark red with aromas of peppery spice and soft warm summer berries. Suits red meats, game, cheese, but is also nice on its own!			
Primitivo, <i>Masso Antico</i> , Italy, 2021, 14%	£5.60	£8.00	£23
From the popular and historic Puglia region, a slow maturation in French oak barrels for 6 months results in an outstanding full-bodied wine with soft tannins that release vanilla notes in the finish.			
Merlot, <i>Don Cayetano</i> , Chile, 2022, 13%	£6.20	£8.60	£25
Rich, rounded and velvet smooth with a ripe, creamy, plum character. Full of fruit from the Luis Felipe Edwards estate, four time winner of 'Chilean Winery of the Year'.			
Cabernet Sauvignon, <i>Errazuriz Max Reserva</i> , Chile, 2019, 13.5%			£24
150 years ago Errazuriz planted the first French grapes in Chile's Aconcagua Valley. This wine is full of blackberry, raspberry and cherry flavours with soft hints of clove, liquorice and bitter chocolate.			
Merlot, <i>Hacienda de Lluna</i> , Spain, 2021, 14%			£25
From elevated, sunkissed vineyards inland from Valencia. A fruit-forward red; smooth enough to enjoy solo, or with chicken, pesto pasta, roasted vegetables and, of course, all kinds of tapas.			
Chinon, <i>Lulu l'Alouette</i> , France, 2020, 12%			£28
Chinon in the Loire Valley produces outstanding reds which are a little bit different from the better known big French classics. Organic, fragrant and light, with fruity hints of raspberry and redcurrant.			
Montagne Saint-Emilion, <i>Château Teyssier</i> , France, 2018, 14.5%			£30
From a 15th century vineyard, lying on a clay-limestone hillside northeast St Emilion. A blend of Merlot and Cabernet Franc, rich and ripe with violet, plum and tobacco notes.

Rosé, <i>La Vieille Ferme</i> , France, 2022, 12.5%	£4.40	£6.20	£18
This beautifully bright rosé is fresh and aromatic with a delicate bouquet and plenty of red and citrus fruit flavours.			
Rosé d'Anjou, <i>Pierre Brevin</i> , France, 2021, 11%	£4.80	£6.60	£19
Slightly sweeter than is typical of its southern cousins, this fruity number marries the boldness of New World rosés with French elegance.

Prosecco by the glass, 10.5% or 11%		£7.00	
Prosecco, <i>Bosco</i> , Italy, NV, 11%			£24
A wonderfully dry prosecco, loaded with citrus aroma and taste, with hints of flowers. Fresh, clean and very dry fruity taste on the palate.			
Saumur, <i>Bouvet</i> , France, NV, 12.5%			£26
Bouvet-Ladubay is owned by Taittinger Champagne house, and has been producing top quality sparkling wines in the Loire using the traditional <i>methode traditionnelle</i> since 1851.			
Champagne, Chanoine Frères <i>Réserve Privée</i> , France, 2015, 12%			£45
A vintage brut Champagne from the region's second oldest house, founded in 1730. Nearly three centuries of experience have produced fine bubbles and rich flavours of candied fruits and hazelnut. An exceptional wine that is well worth the price tag.
